### Grant Announcement Summary

Grant Title: Private Protective Services Training Grant

Description: Funding under this grant program will help provide continuing education training for licensees in the Private Protective Services field in North Carolina.

**Grant Number:** PPSB2015-2

The Private Protective Services Board (the Board) is pleased to announce that they are open to receiving grant applications from {8:00 a.m.} on {June 25, 2015} until {5:00 p.m.} on {September 30, 2015}.

Grants to be considered for awards shall be to nonprofit organizations (501(c)(3) certification), community colleges, or other state schools that are seeking to provide training classes which “will advance education in the private protective services field for the benefit of all licensees, registrants, and trainees.” If your industry does not have nonprofit status, the Board will consider applications if a community college or state school will agree to sponsor the training.

If awarded, the grant will not exceed **\$5,000.00** and shall be for meeting room expenses, speaker costs, training aids, material expenditures, and other similar direct costs. The Board reserves the right to limit travel expenses and will not support expenses that are not directly related to training and professional development. These prohibited expenses include alcohol or bar charges, golf or recreation, gift shop, mini-bar, limousine services, meals that are valued in excess of state employee reimbursement rates per the Office of State Budget and Management Budget Manual (<http://www.osbm.state.nc.us>), expenses related to lobbying or political advocacy and related expenses that give the appearance of extravagance.

The grant must be open to the industry at large and all advertising for the course must include the statement that “This course is being funded in whole or in part by a grant from the Private Protective Services Board”.
